

Important Notice to Animal Owners involved in Showing Animals

The Irish Shows Association would advise all Animal owners who have their Animals Insured to have the Insurance cover extended to cover them while showing Animals at Shows, it may cost very little or nothing at all depending on who you have Insurance with.

The reason for giving this advice is that if your animal were to injure someone or damage someone's property, and it is established that your animal was out of your control at that time, you may be held responsible or partly responsible for any injury or damage caused, & could end up paying all, or part of any Court Award settlement reached.

RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS

Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering the details of their animals (or exhibits) for the final in within one hour of qualifying or before they leave the Show where they qualify

Winners of qualifiers will only be allowed to compete in the final after they make sure that they have documented all their details for the final.

The Irish Shows Association in conjunction with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.

Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES

As from 1 May 2012, any premises (which includes shows, fairs and markets) where horses or other equines are gathered must be registered with the Department.

Owners/persons in charge of such gatherings are required to submit a completed application form for registration and to keep records of movements on/off their premises.

Records must be retained for at least 3 years as they may be required by the Department for the purposes of tracing disease.

Records required are

:The name and address of the owner/person in charge of the premises from which the equine came.

:Premises registration number from which the equine came

:Passport number/UEL number of the animal

It is important therefore that Show organisers should contact their local District Veterinary Office in advance so that consideration can be given to compliance with the requirements outlined above.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Horse-riding is a dangerous sport and all competitors in Ridden Classes are strongly advised, for their own safety, to wear appropriate head gear which complies with up to date safety standards.

DISCIPLINE

The Irish Shows Association expects and will insist upon appropriate behaviour from all Exhibitors and others participating in any of the activities at our Member Shows and will not tolerate inappropriate behaviour. Înappropriate behaviour shall include but not be limited to the following:

- Profanity, coarse or vulgar language or gestures towards judges or other Show officials.
- Harassment or bullying, including using words or actions that threaten, intimidate or undermine judges or other officials before, during or following Member Show activities.
- Failure to follow rules and / or obey instructions.
- Abusing any animal.

Disciplinary Procedures:

Complaints of misconduct against an Exhibitor or other participant at a Member Show shall be investigated and adjudicated upon by a subcommittee appointed by the Irish Shows Association. The said subcommittee shall consist of three members of the board of the Irish Shows Association and shall be known as the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall seek to ensure the existence of consistent, effective, fair and transparent complaint procedures and shall act in accordance with natural and constitutional justice.

A complaint of misconduct/inappropriate behaviour against an Exhibitor or other participant in a Member Show shall be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Member Show within 72 hours. A copy of the complaint shall be sent by the Secretary of the Member Show to the National Secretary of the ISA. A copy of the complaint will be sent by the National Secretary to the person or persons against whom the complaint is made. A person or persons against whom a written complaint is made shall have a period of 14 working days from the date of receipt of the claim to reply to the said complaint; such reply shall be made in writing. Both parties shall state whether an oral hearing of the complaint is sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to hold an oral hearing in regard to the complaint whether or not sought. The Disciplinary Committee shall decide in each case whether to hold such an oral hearing in respect of the complaint, or any part thereof and there shall be no appeal from such decision of the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall, at any time, seek further information from either party. In the event of either party refusing or failing to provide such further information within the time specified by the Disciplinary Committee, the Committee shall be entitled to make a decision on the complaint and/or to hold an oral hearing of the complaint in the absence of a copy of such further information being received by the Disciplinary Committee from either party. The Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to reject a complaint where, in the opinion of the Committee, it finds there is no basis for it.

In the event of a first incident of inappropriate/unacceptable behaviour being deemed to be proved against the offender, the Disciplinary Committee shall issue a written warning to the offender. In the event of any subsequent incident, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose sanctions on the offender, including a prohibition on such offender participating in any of the events/activities at any Member Show of the ISA, provided always that in the event of a first incident of inappropriate/unacceptable behaviour being deemed by the Disciplinary Committee to constitute gross misbehaviour, the Disciplinary Committee shall be entitled to impose such sanctions on the offender as it deems appropriate, including the prohibition on such offender from participating in any of the events/activities of any Member Show of the ISA. The decision of the Disciplinary Committee shall be final.

ALL HORSES, PONIES & DONKEYS MUST HAVE I.H.R. No.

It is recommended that Exhibitors have public liability on their animals.

NOTE FOR INFORMATION REGARDING MOVEMENT OF BOVINE TO SHOWS

SHOW NUMBER FOR MOVEMENT FORMS IS S993

The Department of Agriculture implemented a number of changes on 4th February 2019 which changed the procedures and criteria applicable when applying for a Certificate of Compliance for the movement of cattle. These also impact on the certificate which is required when moving bovine to a Show.

The following sets out the criteria applicable:

- The movement of cattle to and from an Agriculture Show within the State must be recorded on the Animal Identification and Movement System (AIM).
- In line with these changes a specific certificates of Compliance for the "Movement of Bovine from a Single Holding to a Show" must now be requested prior to the movement of animals concerned.
- These certificates can be created by (i) applying on-line using their agfood account or (ii) where the keeper is not on line the certificate can be generated by the local Regional Veterinary Office following receipt of a NBAS31K with issue of the certificate being subject to normal criteria applicable. This form will be available on the Department's Website and will also be included with the Show Circular when issued.
- When applying for this certificate the destination herd / or Show number is not required. The certificate generated will include an "S" symbol.
- The Certificate of Compliance for a Show will continue to be valid for a
 period of up to 30 days. As is currently the case these can be used for the
 movement of animals to a number of shows during the validity period of the
 certificate.
- Please also note Calves which are less than 10 days cannot be moved to a Show.

As is currently the case the Movement Notification Section of the Certificate should be Completed by the Keeper and the Show Secretary who must clearly indicate the Show Number. The Show movement should be recorded on the passport. Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling these requirements lies with the Show Secretary. If the animals move to a herd other than the source herd, the new destination herd must complete and sign the certificate also.

Completed forms should be sent by the Show Secretary to the local RVO within 7 days of the Show.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS - SHEEP

Identification

All sheep must be identified individually with appropriate ear tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System (NSIS).

Movement Documentation

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Sheep from non-restricted flocks only can be moved to shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype only may be exhibited. The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR/10), which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the county where the flock is located.

AIM Notification

The movement of sheep to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM. This is done using a copy of the owners sheep dispatch document as follows:

The owner/keeper presents the signed and completed dispatch document to the show secretary who checks it to ensure that it is completed in full.

The show secretary fills in the MART section of the dispatch document with (i) the show number, (ii) the date of the move back to the source holding (iii) stamps it with the show stamp and (iv) signs the dispatch document.

The show secretary then forwards the completed pink section of the dispatch document to the local DVO within 7 days of the show movement. The show secretary keeps white copy for his/her records. The source/destination keeper keeps the bottom yellow copy to enter it into their flock register. Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary.

Flock Register

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in the keeper's flock register.

General Rules

- 1. The object of the Show is the improvement of Agriculture and Livestock in all its branches.
- **2.** Age will be calculated from the 1st of January of year of birth and if the exact age is known it will be stated in the Entry Form.
- 3. All Exhibits must be bona-fide property of the Exhibitor and in his or her possession at time of entry.
- 4. Persons making entries and failing to send exhibits shall forfeit all entry fees paid.
- 5. *The Committee will not be responsible for loss or accidents of any kind which may occur either to exhibitors, visitors or otherwise.
- 6. Unless there are three entries in each class there will be only one prize. There must be four entries in each class for award of third prize in that class.
- 7. The Judge may with hold any prize where sufficient merit does not appear, and the decision of the Judges will be final, except where misrepresentation or breach of Rules is discovered.
- 8. All objections must be handed to the Secretary, in writing, accompanied with deposit of €50 before the close of the Show, and the question in dispute shall be brought before the Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding and there shall be no appeal to a Court of Law, and all entries are accepted under these conditions. Should the Committee consider the objection frivolous, the deposit of €50 shall be forfeited to the funds of the Show.
- 9. *A competitor will not be awarded more than one prize in any class unless there are three other competitors in the class.
- **9a.** Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class. The I.S.A. will award a rosette to all animal(s) appearing at the finals.
- **10.** The Committee reserves to itself the right of receiving ant entry, or of removing any animal from the Show Grounds without being in any way liable for compensation.
- 11. The Committee will not be liable in any way for any compensation or otherwise, arising out of the holding, abandonment or alteration of date of Show, or for any other claim arising out of or in connection with the Show.
- **12.** * All animals must be provided with a suitable head-stall or halter, and bulls must be secured by a ring in the nose with a chain or rope attached.
- **12a** Intending Exhibitors are advised to ensure that their Public Liability Policy covers the exhibition of livestock at Public Shows.
- **13.** Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials or judges on the part of any owner or servant will disqualify the exhibitor from being awarded a prize and will also disqualify the exhibitor from exhibiting at future Shows.
- 14. No committee member can steward and exhibit animals in the same class.
- **15**. No liability in respect of injury, illness, loss or damage caused by or in connection with or arising from the moving under power of any vehicle in the car park or show grounds.
- **16.** All vehicles in Show Grounds are parked at owners risk. No responsibility is accepted for loss or damage to property
- 17. Each exhibitor should be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by or arising out of, any animal or article exhibited by him or her for its description given in the catalogue and indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.

On the day of the Show the Grounds will be open at 8.30 a.m. All exhibits in the Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep Sections must be in their places not later than 10.30 a.m. and exhibits in the Home Produce, Crafts, Baking and Youth Sections must be in place not later than 10 a.m. Exhibits arriving after above times may be refused admission by Stewards. Crafts and Home Produce Exhibits must not be removed from Vocational School before 4.30 p.m. The prizes awarded may be forfeited if any prize-winning exhibit is removed before the time specified in this Rule. Exhibits will be handed out between 4.30pm and 5.30pm. The Committee reserve the right to refuse admission to Show.

A. GENERAL RULES FOR IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS 2019

Shows wishing to participate in the 2019 Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep class prize money for the year 2018 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full, to the Irish Shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period of not more than **30 days** from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable. Any show or competitor in breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these championships.

These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating shows and must be strictly observed.

B. SHOW HOLDING QUALIFIERS

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association.

C. RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOLDING QUALIFYING ROUNDS

- a. Selected shows must hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify.
- b. The qualifier class if possible should be held as the first (1st) class in the relevant section of the show.
- c. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held in accordance with the relevant rules.
- d. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifiers No prize money to be paid to qualifiers.
- e. Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class.

The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful Qualifiers on appearance at the Final

- f. A show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that Championship on the day of the Final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association." However Shows who hold qualifiers for Horses, Ponies & Cattle may ask exhibitors to enter the exhibit in at least one other class at their show.
- g. Animals qualified for Finals are not eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition
- h. Shows should appoint competent persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and those whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
- i. Animal Passports and Micro Chips should be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.
- j. On completion of judging, Stewards should instruct the successful competitors to attend at the Show Secretary's Office within one hour and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final.
- k. The show must appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.
- 1. Show Secretaries must forward complete result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association within three (3) days following the holding of the show.
- N.B Shows must return results card marked "No Competition" for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.

D. RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS

A. Exhibitors accept that the Judges decision is final in all cases.

Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or case for complaint arises the matter should only be dealt with under f. below.

- B. Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals (or exhibits) for the final in accordance with j. and k. above, within one hour of qualifying.
- C. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
- D. The Irish Shows Association in conjunction with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.
- E. Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows Office for details of any championships and **not** the sponsor involved.

F Objections must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. representative at the show or the Show Secretary within half an hour following the completion of judging, together with a fee of 50 euro, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.

G Any Exhibitor who makes a false declaration or misrepresents a fact regarding themselves or their exhibit is liable to disqualification and or forfeiture of any prizes awarded

E. RESPONSIBILITIES OF SHOWS HOSTING CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

- A. A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the Show and forwarded to the Irish Shows Association within 30 Days of the final
- B. Championship finals must start not later than 2 pm on the day of the show and the advertised time of starting must be adhered to as far as practicable, if necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.

NOTICES OF INTEREST TO CHAMPIONSHIP PARTICIPANTS IRISH LAW (EU DIRECTIVE)

Under Irish Law all horses moving from one location to another must be accompanied by their passports. It is in your own interest to ensure this is the case. Failure to do so is an offence under Irish Law and is liable on summary conviction to result in a fine up to \in 3000. All passports must be registered with the name of the current owner.

» **Embryo Transfer:** Where a foal is produced by this method the dams passport must bear a declaration dated, stamped and signed by the stallion owner (or accredited practitioner where AI is involved) stating the date on which the dam was last covered (or inseminated) and the name of the covering stallion.
