Where possible separate entrance and exit points should be provided for large and small vehicles to facilitate prompt and safe site access and egress and parking. High visibility jacket and safety boots to be worn by stewards and show team. Safety signage erected in livestock area regarding access/egress points for livestock between designated parking area and showing area. Livestock are brought into site on board vehicles and unloaded or loaded in parking area at all times by owner Animals should be allowed to relax after travelling and unloading before they are brought to the show ring The steward supervising the unloading of cattle must be satisfied that the animal is calm and can be controlled at all times. If the animal is agitated and not likely to settle down then the steward can refuse entry to the show and ask the owner for the animal to be reloaded and taken off site in the interests of public safety and animal safety All animals must be wear a harness to which a leading rope can be secured Stewarts to ensure orderly positioning of vehicles in parking area to enable safe unloading & loading of livestock for washing, grooming and showing Where possible wash area should have adequate drainage and or be covered with matting or concrete to minimise water ponding and development of soft muddy ground at washing and grooming station. Washing station should be located away from public area due to likelihood of slippy underfoot conditions Appropriate barrier (well secured stakes, rails, gates and orange mesh) should be erected around the showing area to securely tie up live stock f	Show committee
